Our adopted unit that we fondly call the “**Concord Marines**” is officially Detachment 2, Alpha Company, Beach and Terminal Operations of the 4th Marine Logistics Group. They are located in the Marine Corps Reserve Training Center in Concord. It is commanded by Captain Caitlin Ferrarell. Their First Sergeant is Simon Sandoval.

But wait! There’s more!

This unit is soon to be deactivated and will be reborn on September 29, 2013 as the brand new 6th Air Naval Gunfire Liason Co. (ANGLICO), Force Headquarters Group, Marine Forces Reserve. The new Inspector/Instructor is Lt Col. Christopher Curtin. Captain Ferrarell and 1stSgt Sandoval will be staying on.

They will grow substantially, taking over the entire building which they used to share with the Army. They are growing in strength from 11 Active Duty Marines to about 17. They are authorized to have about 200 Reservists (including about 50 Officers) versus their recent strength of 96.

Their mission is to develop and maintain a force of Marine Reserves in a state of readiness should they need to be deployed in support of the regular Marines 5th ANGLICO.

These Marines will be trained for a completely different role than the previous group.

Naval Strike and Air Warfare Center

This was a Navy League Event extraordinaire that gave guests a “bird’s eye view” of what our Navy “TOP GUN” base is all about. The training of these young men is intense and gives our country the best naval air instructors and Contra Costa County, Fallon, Marin, Sonoma, Reno, Lake Merritt, San Francisco, and Stockton. Jean Sharkey, the event coordinator put together a tour that will be long remembered. We were able to see the facility’s training auditoriums; the jets take off and land from the Air Station Tower!

Zip, the public affairs escort from the base, kept us on our toes with great stories and facts about Fallon. The 125 nautical miles, 250,000 acres of land with 8,000 base acres make up this dynamic training base.

The topography of Afghanistan presented challenges for Navy aviators attempting to reach and destroy installations in the deep canyons and ravines of the rugged terrain. A special ‘course’ was provided at NAS Fallon in ‘strafing’, a technique used in World War Two and before. The rockets and other weapons fired from Navy aircraft were not as effective as desired.

We concluded our visit with a breakfast at the Galley, and then to the tower to watch the final flights of their graduates. Also toured the Hanger to view the Rescue Helicopter the “SAR Longhorn” and hear about its responsibilities of rescue on land and some water rescues. These moments only made all of appreciate even more our active duty men and women and their dedication to our country.

Navy League to Commission USS AMERICA in S.F

The Secretary of the Navy has asked the Pacific Central Region to sponsor the commissioning of USS AMERICA (LHA-6), and 884-foot amphibious assault ship with a crew of 1,000-plus. The event will be held in San Francisco in early September 2014, at which time AMERICA will join the Pacific Fleet with home port in San Diego. The carrier-like vessel, which will not fit thru the Panama Canal, carries helicopters, Osprey aircraft and Marines on missions.



Year of the Military Women



An exhibit at the U.S. Navy Memorial in Washington D.C., honors the contributions and sacrifices of female service members. Year of Military Women, which debuted in April and will run through April 2014, was created in partnership with the U.S. Army Women's museum, the Women in Military Service for American Memorial and other institutions.

"We thought this was a story whose time had more than come," says Vice Admiral John Totushek, USN (Ret), president and CEO of the U.S. Navy Memorial Foundation. "Women have been supporting the defense of our country since the Revolutionary War, though they often didn't get the same recognition as their male counterparts. We wanted the American public to understand the contributions these women have made."

The exhibit features important dates in the history of American female military service and how the military utilized women over the years. Other highlights include a display of uniforms worn by pioneering military, including one worn by Navy Capt. Mildred McAfee, the first WAVES (Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service) director during World War II. "Year of Military Women has gotten great acceptance from the women who have served or are serving" notes Totushek. "Its message is that it's not just men who have served our country for the past 230 plus years, it's the men and women who have done so much to keep this nation free."

Facts from 1813

James Madison was president of the U.S. during the war of 1812

By 1813 there were 18 states: CT, DE, GA, KY, LA, MD, MA, NH, NJ, NY, NC, OH, PA, RI, SC, TN, VT and VA

The phrase "Uncle Sam" first was used in the War of 1812, when service members referred to food from meat packer Samuel Wilson as Uncle Sam's grub.
