



FLEET WEEK IN OCTOBER

First and foremost, combining forces and talents helps to facilitate better communications and partnering between the Sector's departments. Additionally, it generates synergistic effects through cross training and interdepartmental operations.

Several Sector key personnel will be transferring this summer, including the Deputy, CAPT Mike Day (who will assume command of Sector New York); the Planning Chief, CDR Lexia Littlejohn; our Waterways Management Chief and acting Prevention Department Head, CDR Amy Wirts, and; the Command Center Chief, LCDR Shawn Lansing.
